MATH HELP AT HOME

Sample Additional Practice Exercise 1

Find the product.

$$3 \times 5 = \underline{15}$$

3 groups of 5: skip count 5, 10, 15.

HOME ACTIVITY

Times Table

MATERIALS

Grid Paper, Pencil

ACTIVITY

Processing math: 8%

Help your child create their own table of multiplication facts. Allow plenty of room to write. Make rows for 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10. Make columns for the same numbers.

Now have your child write the products in the table, in this order:

Row for 0, then column for 0.

Row for 1, then column for 1.

Row for 2, then column for 2.

Row for 5, then column for 5.

Row for 10, then column for 10.

Row for 9, then column for 9.

Celebrate all the multiplication facts your child has already learned! Ask your child to count the empty boxes: there are only 25 left. Now use the table to help your child practice. You cover a product and have your child state the fact. For example, you cover 35 and your child moves across the row and up the column to find 7 and 5 to multiply:
 $7 \times 5 = 35$ (or $5 \times 7 = 35$).
