MATH HELP AT HOME

Sample Additional Practice Exercise 1

Solve the problem.

Lupita cleans 7 times as many paint brushes as Mike. Mike cleans 8 paint brushes. How many paint brushes does Lupita clean?

56 paint brushes

Lupita cleans more brushes than Mike does, 7 times as many. Multiply 7 by the number of brushes that Mike cleans. Mike cleans 8 brushes: $7 \times 8 = 56$.

HOME ACTIVITY

Bank Account

MATERIALS

Processing math: 100%

Paper, Pencil

ACTIVITY

Use a piece of paper to create a pretend bank account statement. Write, "Balance: \$xxx" at the top. On the next line write, "Withdrawal: \$265". Below that write, "Balance: \$124". Tell your child that the balance is the total amount of money in the bank account. A withdrawal is an amount of money you take out of the account. A deposit is an amount of money you add to the account. Ask your child how they would find how much money was in this bank account before you made the withdrawal. They will add $265 + 124$, then estimate to check the answer, and replace "xxx" at the top with 389. Continue this activity by writing "Deposit: \$319" on the next line and "Balance: \$xxx" on the following line. Ask your child to find the account balance after the deposit of \$319 was made.
